This is most vulnerable area as far as construction operations are concerned. To improve the situation, the safety awareness and training and re-training are very much essential for the workforce as well as high level officials of construction industries. Further, it is also necessary for the managers, Engineers and supervisors to understand the statutory provisions under BOCW Act & Central Rules.

Therefore, Central Labour Institute, DGFASLI Mumbai is providing online training platform for Intended participants to learn from their own place using mobile phone/laptop/desktop (with webcam, microphone & speaker) in view of COVID-19 pandemic situation/preventive measures.
