Background

Industrial ergonomics is the design and use of equipment and systems that do not damage industrial workers health. Despite the increased level of automated equipment in the manufacturing industry, ergonomic risk factors for workers are still high due to the physical work. Providing appropriate manual materials handling training that involves increasing a worker's awareness of their movements and body. This gives the worker more chance to avoid potential injuries by self-adjusting when they feel they are moving into an unsafe zone.

Therefore, Regional Labour Institute, Chennai is providing online training platform for Intended participants to learn Industrial Ergonomics and safe manual material handling from their own place using mobile phone/laptop/desktop (with webcam, microphone & speaker) in view of COVID-19 pandemic situation/preventive measures.
